Case-Ex: Honor – ARMY VALUES (PVT Montes and PFC Hart)

(Bolded questions are included in the Case-Ex video interface)

Part 1:

PVT Montes describes one of the Soldiers in his squad dropping her grenade at the range. He watched one of the Drill Sergeants instantly jump on the live grenade. PVT Montes describes how the Drill Sergeant immediately got back up and calmly ordered the Private to continue training.

- 9. How do you think the Drill Sergeant's actions impacted PVT Montes and the others?
